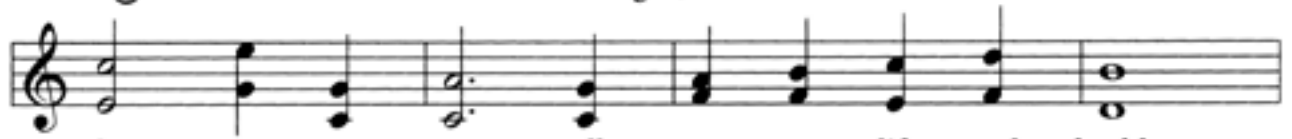



Presider Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Presider Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

Answer I do.

Presider Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Presider Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Answer I do.

The Baptism

The candidate is presented to the Presider.

Presider Kit Smith, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

Using chrism, the Presider makes the sign of the cross on the forehead, saying:

Presider I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Presider prays over the newly baptized.

Presider Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.
Amen.

The Giving of the Light

The Presider then gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying:

Presider Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

When the newly baptized has received a candle, the people say:

**All Let your light so shine before others
that they may see your good works
and glorify your Father in heaven.**

Presider Let us welcome the newly baptized.

**All We receive you into the household of God.
Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection,
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**
