

Presider	Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?
Answer	I renounce them.
Presider	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?
Answer	I do.

## The Baptismal Covenant

Presider	Do you believe in God the Father?
All	I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
Presider	Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
All	I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
	He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
Presider	Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
All	I believe in God the Holy Spirit,
	the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints,
	the forgiveness of sins,
	the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
Presider	Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
All	I will, with God's help.
Presider	Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?
All	I will, with God's help.
Presider	Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?
All	I will, with God's help.
Presider	Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?
All	I will, with God's help.
Presider	Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
All	I will, with God's help.
Presider	Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?
All	I will, with God's help.

## The Baptism

The candidate is presented to the Presider.

*Presider* Kit Smith, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

#### All Amen.

Using chrism, the Presider makes the sign of the cross on the forehead, saying:

*Presider* I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Presider prays over the newly baptized.

Presider Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace.Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

## The Giving of the Light

The Presider then gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying:

*Presider* Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

When the newly baptized has received a candle, the people say:

All	Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.
Presider	Let us welcome the newly baptized.
All	We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

### The Peace

*Presider* Alleluia. Christ has been raised from the dead. The peace of the risen Lord be always with you.All And also with you.



But we failed to honour your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people. Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Saviour Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: this is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:


